DIRECTORS' NOTE

Written in just two months time, Charles Dickens had hoped to make some money for his family with the sale of A Christmas Carol. However, though over 6,000 copies were sold in the first week of publication, his commitment to the artistic quality of the book had him spend much of his earnings on the fancy publishing and he actually retained very little money for the family. Still, this relatively simple story, has profoundly changed people's hearts and minds for the last 180 years!

Dickens had been raised in a poor family much like Bob and Emily Cratchit's, and therefore was determined to commit much of his time to charities and social issues throughout his life. He was especially concerned with the many impoverished children in London who turned to crime and deliquency



in order to survive. He founded the Ragged School movement to make a better life for children through education.

Dickens made it clear that A Christmas Carol was to be a jovial telling saying in December of 1843: "I have endeavoured in this Ghostly little book, to raise the Ghost of an Idea, which shall not put my readers out of humour with themselves, with each other, with the season, or with me. May it haunt their houses pleasantly, and no one wish to lay it."

Still, without saying a word, the characters of Want and Ignorance who arrive with the Ghost of Christmas Present articulate Dicken's intended moral best: when we, as a society, do not care for each other, we cannot survive. We must, he says, "honour Christmas in our hearts, and try to keep it all the year."

Sincere and many thanks to all who have dedicated their time, talent and treasure to this amazing experience. We hope you enjoy the performance as much as we have loved putting it together for you!
