Story Overview:

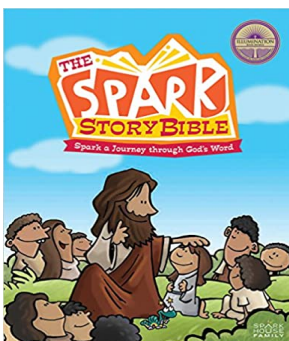
A remarkable thing happened next.....watch this week's Sunday School video to hear the rest of this story.
