



Welcome to Sunday School! Today is the 2nd in our 3-part series on uncovering the Hidden Blessings in the Strange, Gross and Weird stories in the Bible.

As we know, the Bible is made up of 66 books and that means that there are LOTS of different stories in the Bible. And some that are just plain odd. Before we give up on trying to understand some of the odd ones, let's take a deeper look and see if we can find a Hidden Blessing in these stories – something that makes sense out of the weirdness that we can learn from and apply to our life.

A BIG FISH SWALLOWS JONAH:

Our second strange story comes from the Old Testament, 750 years before Jesus was born, from the book of Jonah - a short book - only 4 chapters long and easy to read in one sitting.

God told the prophet Jonah to go and preach a warning to the people of Nineveh. But that was a job Jonah didn't want to do. He didn't particularly care what happened to the people of Nineveh. They were mean people and Israel's enemy. Jonah boarded a boat headed to Tarshish (far away from Nineveh) to get away from what God was calling him to do. When God started a storm, sailors on the boat tossed Jonah into the sea thinking he was the reason for the storm because he had told them that he was not following what God had asked him to do. A great fish swallowed the prophet and he stayed in the belly of the fish (for 3 days!) until he told God that he changed his mind and would go to Nineveh. The big fish spit (vomited) Jonah out and he made his way to Nineveh and preached to the people and they changed their evil ways. Jonah was a peace maker! God was glad the people changed after hearing Jonah but Jonah was upset that God hadn't punished them. Jonah discovered that God is a merciful and compassionate God, very patient, full of faithful love, and willing not to destroy. This book shows us that God is eager to forgive. God wants people everywhere to believe in God and live their lives doing good and treating each other well.

HIDDEN BLESSING:

Is this story really about being stuck inside the smelly, gross belly of a fish for 3 days? No. It is most likely a parable - which is a short story that teaches an important lesson. The book of Jonah is a story about how God can work through humans, even ones who don't always agree with the way God works. We need to trust God and listen to what he is asking of us. God loves us and only wants the best for us - even if it sometimes comes in some strange ways.

SCRIPTURE: Meanwhile, the Lord provided a great fish to swallow Jonah. Jonah was in the belly of the fish for three days and three nights. –Jonah 1:17

Family Discussion:

Be Jonah - Activity:

Find a small cramped dark place and lift up your prayers and concerns to God. Make notes of what you talked to God about and tuck them away and revisit them in a year.

Did You Know?:

- Fish can recognize faces!
- The biggest fish (fish are cold blooded) in the world is the **whale shar**k - around 32 feet long and can weigh 9 tons. They are very calm and docile creatures.
- Whales are not fish but warm blooded mammals. The blue whale can be as big as 98 feet long and weigh 190 tons!
