# Message from our Senior Pastor. **Rev.** Janet **Forbes**

# The many faces of Jesus

Who is Jesus? The question seems simple and straightforward. But the answer is complex and subtle because it concerns the present identity of a person who lived in the ever more distant past. Whereas the question, Who was Jesus?, requests information that would identify him in his own time and place by referring to his date and place of birth, parents, occupation, social status, and time of death, asking, "Who IS Jesus?" signals an interest in his current identity.

With Marcus Borg, Professor of Religion and Culture at Oregon State University, and author of The Heart of Christianity, coming to St. Andrew United Methodist Church on March 18 and 19, I am returning to questions about the intentional Christian life. What does it mean, as our Mission Statement asserts, to "grow toward full humanity by living the teachings of Jesus: love, acceptance, justice, and hope"?

I am currently reading a book, Who is Jesus? History in Perfect Tense, by Leander E. Keck, Professor of Biblical Theology at Yale Divinity School. Keck is a frequent scholar in the Disciple Bible Study Series. He is interested in the "is-ness" of the Jesus that was. Did you catch that distinction?

Keck remembers that the ancient Greeks used the perfect tense of a verb to distinguish the ongoing impact of a completed action from its occurrence in the past. "The door was opened" assets that a past action caused the door to be no longer shut, though it might have been closed later. "The door is opened," on the other hand, asserts that it still remains open as the result of past action. So, to speak of history in perfect tense is to consider the ongoing-ness of something from the past, namely Jesus. (Those of you who are students of rhetoric note that I also preach in perfect tense in order to set images in current reality!)

Our Lenten Series, "The Many Faces of Jesus," is the invitation to explore the ongoing meaning - the perfect tense of Jesus. What does it mean to be a follower, a disciple, of Jesus today? In listening to persons who are seeking the spiritual life, I have learned that many people are skeptical about "organized religion", but are compelled by what it means to follow Jesus! The exploration of that hunger leads people to communities of persons who share the friendship, the convictions, the transformation, the hope of the Christian life.

Join us in worship as we seek a holy Lent by exploring the many faces of Jesus.

This journey of a lifetime includes roundtrip airfare from Denver to Tel Aviv, deluxe motorcoaches and guided sightseeing to the major biblical/archeological sites in the Galilee, Nazareth, Megiddo, Caesarea, Jerusalem, Bethlehem, Jericho, and Qumran. ### **Be A Prayer Player**

Prayer has been the focus of many stories recently in the news, and we are introducing our youth to the concept of community prayer through our Prayer Partners, adults that are praying specifically for our youth currently enrolled in our Confirmation program.

The more we talked about with youth about praying, the more we realized what a difficult thing it can be to do! Sometimes we get intimidated by our feelings, or don't believe that we have the words we need to express our true emotions to God. Sometimes, we're not even sure if there is a God, and if not, then why would we pray anyway? Sometimes, we confuse wishes or hopes with prayer, sometimes we aren't sure what to pray for. Sometimes we think God's a shrink so we only go to pray when we have problems, and sometimes we just don't feel like praying.

Well, prayer can be an anytime thing! It doesn't have to be overly formal, or performed in complete silence with shimmering light glowing through a stained glass window. It can be in your car, it can be before dinner, it can be at work. It can be out loud or under your breath, it can fill your mind with joys or with concerns. It can be about serious issues or simple joys, about family, friends, and even (gasp) yourself.

It is not selfish or one-sided, but a way to begin dialogue with God. Prayer can work miracles and prayers can be answered. Prayer promises change.

That promise is what we have conveyed to our youth and their prayer partners for this session of Confirmation. The high school years contain some of the most challenging games a person will ever face, and it always helps to have another player on your team when facing challenges. So lend some support to yourself and others this Lenten season by becoming a prayer player.
