In those days John the Baptist appeared in the wilderness of Judea, proclaiming, "Repent, for the kingdom of heaven has come near." This is the one of whom the prophet Isaiah spoke when he said, "The voice of one crying out in the wilderness: 'Prepare the way of the Lord, make his paths

John the Baptist is an Advent adventurer, stalking through the wilderness of his time on the trail of the messiah. He's the original hellfire-and-brimstone preacher, but he also offers hope to the community he rakes over the coals. A willingness to hope is a willingness to enter the wilderness. Hope is not a domesticated state of mind. It seems to camp out in odd places, crops up at the worst possible times. Just as we resign ourselves to the minimum wages of life with no benefits, hope whispers that we shouldn't settle for despair's bottom line. Hope thrives in the barren places of our lives.

As an Advent proponent, I love John the Baptist – at least from afar. (I'm not sure I would have been comfortable hanging out with a locust-eating, camel-hair-wearing prophet.) But John the Baptist's message to us during this frantic season of the year draws me in. I mean, here's this guy out in the wilderness proclaiming God's word, "Prepare the way of the Lord, make his paths straight." Who wants to hear the word, repent? And who wants the extra work of making paths straight and all?

Yet we Advent journeyers also find ourselves in a sort of wilderness, a wilderness of excess, of noise and clutter and busyness, a wilderness of secular, consumer culture giving us the message that Christmas will be perfect if we buy the right presents – and do it now! We Advent people

are crying out in this wilderness, trying to prepare the way in our own lives, trying to make a place, a holy space for the coming of the Christ child. We are called to prepare the way in the wilderness of pre-Christmas chaos, where rushed schedules and commercial chatter drown out silence and prayers.

And hope goes with us, is with us, in this wilderness of chaos. Hope becomes a critical part of our Advent survival kit, guiding us through the distractions, reminding us of our single task: to prepare the way.

God of hope, help me prepare the way for you in the wilderness of chaos. Give me strength, wisdom, and patience to clear a path for you through my cluttered heart and life. Amen.

Enjoy the simple pleasures of the advent of joy.

Is God inviting you into a deeper relationship?

Join us here at St. Luke's, for an experiential workshop Centering Prayer, a prayer method where we sit in silence with God, or, as Gregory the Great expressed it we "rest in God." Though we often think of prayer as thoughts or feelings expressed in words, this is only one expression. Centering prayer facilitates the movement from more active forms of prayer into a receptive prayer of resting in God where we experience God's presence. This is traditionally called contemplative prayer. Thomas Keating says contemplative prayer is "the opening of mind and heart, body and emotions – our whole being – to God, the Ultimate Mystery, beyond thoughts, words and emotions."

The method of Centering Prayer draws from ancient prayer practices in the Christian Contemplative Tradition. In the 1970's three Trappist monks, William Meninger, Basil Pennington and Thomas Keating, distilled Centering Prayer into a simple method of prayer that helps to quiet our faculties so we can cooperate with the gift of God's presence. Thomas Keating says, "In this resting or stillness the mind and heart are not actively seeking God, but are beginning to experience, to taste, what they have been seeking."

The Introductory Workshop will be held **Saturday, January 22** 9:00am-1:00pm Registration will begin at 8:30am Cost:Workshop \$15.00 (includes light breakfast and snacks)

Two long-time centering prayer practitioners, Julie Saad and Bob Albrecht, will present the workshop. They are both on the staff of Contemplative Outreach. The workshop will include instruction on the method of Centering Prayer and two sessions of actual practice of the prayer. For those who are interested in further exploring the prayer practice, join our Contemplative Fellowship Group, Thursday evenings from 6:30-8:00pm.

More *from Les*: "Holiday Rituals"

It was the beginning of the Advent season, 1957. Betty and I had been dating for only a few weeks when she invited me to come to her parents' house one Saturday evening for a meal after the family returned from the annual Christmas tree party. "You won't be alone," she said, "Jim will be here too." I had been dating Betty for a couple

of months and Jim's presence was probably more for my comfort than anything else. From this visit, I discovered something about her family and about myself as I experienced one of their family traditions.

Betty's parents, Loyd and Barbara Hoback, were part of a group that had been close friends for years. The group included Dan and Ortha Courter, Cookie and Nelda Courter, Jackie and Frank Thompson, Shirley and Berk Nay and 10 kids! They would get together for card parties, birthday celebrations and a variety of activities such as dancing, and bowling. One of these activities, as I was to learn this weekend, was the group's version of Christmas tree hunting and cutting.

So, that afternoon, I cleaned up, put on nice clothes, and drove to the Hoback home. As I arrived at the front door, feeling a bit nervous, I was somewhat taken aback!

The tree-cutters had already arrived and some were in the living room working on a stand for Loyd and Barbara's tree. The house was pretty warm from all the cooking and the men had stripped down to their long johns as they worked on the tree stand.

The women were in the kitchen, putting together the meal. They too had stripped off outer layers of clothing in the house. *Informality* was the watchword for the moment.

I felt pretty overdressed in my jacket and slacks, but was immediately welcomed into the group and invited to join in with the singing. When the tree was in its stand, each person took a turn hanging an ornament. Brothers Cookie and Dan, singers in the local Methodist choir, sang a couple of carols. Cups of cider and hot chocolate were handed around.

Jim Hansen, and I agreed to perform a couple of the acts that we had done at a recent High School talent assembly. I had brought my 45rpm record player and Jim and I "lip-synched" a couple of popular songs such as "All I Want for Christmas is My Two Front Teeth" and "I Ain't Gettin' Nuttin' for Christmas!" We generally made fools of ourselves, and the group loved it!

Style, stylishness and "proper" were not part of this group's way of celebrating together. How you looked and acted were not key elements of a successful tree cutting and decoration party. Enthusiastic participation and warmth were!

Rituals are important, they help us affirm and celebrate who we are and what we believe. Participating in the Hoback, Courter, Thompson, Nay Advent ritual helped me understand what sort of community I might be joining. And I loved it! Fortunately, they, and Betty, liked me too!

How does one fall deeply in love with another? How does a person become part of a family? What remains after initial attraction begins to wear off? When do things like trust and commitment begin to take hold in personal relationships?

For me trust and commitment began to grow that Advent evening with the Hoback family and friends.

Guatemala & YOU!

Each year a group from St. Luke's travels to Lemoa Guatemala to do mission work. In the past we have worked on an orphanage, built chicken coops, built an expansion on a retreat center and we have begun building adobe homes for women left widowed by the violent Guatemalan conflicts of the past. In March 2011, St. Luke's will be sending 2 mission teams to Guatemala with plans to build 4 new adobe homes for the widows of Lemoa and 8 chicken coops! In order to raise funds for this project, the mission team is inviting members of the

St. Luke's community to a Burrito Breakfast on the morning of Jan. 2. All funds raised will be used to purchase the building supplies for these projects.

In Guatemala rural children are only able to complete up to 6th grade at the most, with many dropping out before 3rd grade to work for their families. Through the Pura Vida sponsorship program, you can help a student continue on in school beyond these early grades. The \$400 annual sponsorship fee covers their tuition, transportation costs, uniform, books and a small stipend to help support their family. For some students, they may be the only person in their family to complete an education beyond Elementary School. During the month of December, we will have a table in the Fellowship Hall where you can learn more about the sponsorship program and select a student to sponsor.


Pumpkin Patch Success!
