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

Fearless Conversations and The Art of Listening

Conflict, debate, and disagreement throw many people into a tizzy out of fear or intense feelings. In most situations such reactions come from a

simple fact. People have not practiced the skills necessary to engage in topics that hold a spectrum of opinions and wide range of emotions. However, practice and experience can give people confidence to engage with these subjects.

The hope of the Gospel goes beyond comfort in possible conflict and invites us to healthy dialog so we can and will continue to gather at the table of the resurrected Christ. Coming back to the table speaks to the possibility of



disagreeing and still respecting. Returning to the table reminds us of our commonalities of hopes, fears, needs, and blessings. Engaging at the table creates a space of sharing at the deepest level through listening, affirming, and holding each other in the light.

Fearless conversations are crucial to the well-being of any community for in our diversity we experience the Kingdom of God. The timing of fearless conversations also seems pertinent to current cultural situations and in light of the upcoming United Methodist General Conference. Church can be a safe place to model such conversations, to engage with tough issues, and to practice preparing and living into the sacred space of a shared table with friends and enemies.

Rev. Steve Goodier, in his *Life Support System*, writes about THE GREATEST COMPLIMENT.

The story is told of Franklin Roosevelt, who often endured long receiving lines at the White House. He complained that no one really paid any attention to what was said.

One day, during a reception, he decided to try an experiment. To each person who came down the line and shook his hand, he murmured, "I murdered my grandmother this morning." The guests responded with phrases like, "Marvelous!" Or, "Keep up the good work." Or, "We are proud of you. God bless you, sir."

It was not until the end of the line, while greeting the ambassador from Bolivia, that his words were actually heard. Not quite knowing what to say, the ambassador leaned over and whispered, "I'm sure she had it coming."

There are several reasons that no true listening can ever take place in a fast-paced receiving line. Music, noise and the activity of other people can be distracting. What's more, the purpose of the line is more for a quick greeting rather than concerted listening. And one more thing... folks are more intent on getting out what they want to say to the president than listening to what might be said to them. But I wonder... did they WANT to hear what he had to say?

All my life I've carried a mental picture of my uncle the way I saw him so many times - stooped over, head bowed low, intently listening to whomever he was chatting with. He was a tall and big man and a bit hard of hearing. The reason for his unusual posture was no doubt to get his ear closer to the speaker's mouth, but it gave the illusion that, for a few minutes at least, he wanted nothing more than to listen carefully to every word the other had to say.

Henry David Thoreau wrote, "The greatest compliment that was ever paid me was when one asked me what I thought, and attended to my answer."The way my uncle listened was as if he were paying the speaker a supreme compliment. His body language said, "Here, let me get a little closer and listen. I truly want to hear what you have to say."

The key to good listening isn't technique; it's desire. Eye contact is helpful. So is asking pertinent questions, paraphrasing to be sure you understand, refraining from interrupting or changing the subject - all of these techniques are helpful. But the best way to ensure that you will listen well isn't in HOW you listen, it's mostly in simply wanting to understand.

(Thank you, Steve!) I believe that is the crucial question. Do we really want to understand? Until we truly want to understand the other person, we'll never listen well... or fearlessly.

What if you invited someone new to join you? What a difference you will make for them (and you!)






Volunteering as a Family

UMCOR Relief Supplies: During the week of July 19-25, a group of volunteers from St. Luke's will be working at the United Methodist Committee on Relief Depot (warehouse) in Salt Lake City. We will be processing relief supplies that are sent by UMCOR to survivors of disasters in the United States and around the world. We invite you to contribute supplies for UMCOR health kits for the team to take to Salt Lake City.

These supplies include: new wash cloths; new hand towels (15 X 25 inches to 17 X 27 inches; kitchen, cleaning and microfiber towels not acceptable); bath size soap (3 oz. and larger size, do not remove from original packaging); toothbrushes (in a single package); Band-Aids (3/4 inch to 1 inch-size); nail clippers.

Our team will also be visiting Crossroads Urban Center, a Methodist-connected ministry that helps people in need in the Salt Lake City area. They need donations of new socks and new underwear.

A labeled bin will be in the Missions closet for your donations. They will be collected on Saturday, July 18.

Crossroads Urban Center is the only National Mission Institution in the Rocky Mountain Conference. Crossroads operates one of Utah's busiest emergency food pantries, a free/ low-cost thrift store, an emergency assistance fund to help with prescriptions, bus passes, gasoline and other needs, extensive holiday food programs, and community organizing and advocacy with low income people and their allies. In 2014, Crossroads' direct service programs touched some 36,300 families and individuals in need. Hundreds of volunteers help serve thousands of people in need through Crossroads every year. Since 1966, Crossroads has been serving low-income people in the greater Salt Lake area. The agency emerged from the work of the Women's Home Missionary Society of the Methodist Episcopal Church in the 19th century.


