Choir Tours Greece and Türkiye!

Kalimera! (Hello) Thirty-eight adventurous singers and instrumentalists traveled to Greece and Türkiye on a choir tour May 27 through June 4. We toured the 2000-year-old Acropolis (Parthenon) and performed our first concert at the First Evangelical Church in Athens. A local community chorus

performed the second half of the concert. It was great to have local musicians join us as they brought additional audience members.

On May 29 we boarded a ship for a three-day cruise to the Greek islands including Mykonos, where many of us visited the windmills and cafes in "Little Venice". The next morning, we docked in Kusadadi, Türkiye and visited Ancient Ephesus and the Terrace Houses. While in Ephesus, Rev. Liza shared some spiritual context about Paul's travels and teachings to the Ephesians, and we ended with communion. The second part of the day was to Patmos, considered a holy island for Christians as John wrote the book of Revelation there when he was exiled by the Roman State. We ended the day with our second concert in the ship's amphitheatro.

Next, we toured the Archaeological Museum of Heraklion on the island of Crete then traveled to the beautiful island of Santorini for the evening. The next morning, we disembarked and visited Corinth on the way to Patras where we performed our final concert which we shared with the Choir of the Cathedral Church of Saint Andrew of Patras.

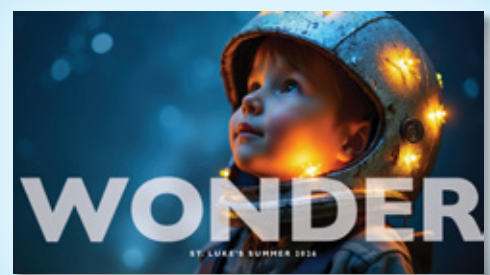
On the way back to Athens, we visited Epidaurus and the most famous theatre in the ancient world, known for its beauty and its incredible acoustics.

From June 10-13, the Mountain Sky Annual Conference "The Way of Loving Boldly" was held in Billings, Montana. United Methodists from all of Colorado, Utah, Wyoming, Montana, and a small part of Idaho gathered for worship, service, fellowship, and the business of the church.



Participating from St. Luke's were Hazel Hanson, Karin Wesson, Stephanie Kirk, Susan McIntosh, Rev. Sallie Suby-Long, Rev. Liza Stoltz Hanson, and Rev. Calob Rundell.

Here are some highlights:

- Clergy appointments are set and read by the Bishop. Our clergy team will continue service to St. Luke's for 2026-27
- 70 years of full Ordination for Women was celebrated! (From Rev. Liza: "It was particularly emotional to have my daughter's arm around me as we spoke the liturgy. I'm so proud of the church she gets to witness today. And I'm immensely grateful for the women who have gone before me.")
- 30 years of the ministry of Deacons was celebrated!
- Delegates were elected to the 2028 General Conference and Jurisdictional Conference. *General Conference is the gathering of the worldwide United Methodist Church, and makes important decisions about belief, practice, and church organization. Jurisdictional Conference is a large geographic gathering (in our case the entire Western US and US Pacific Islands) that elects and appoints Bishops.*
- Susan McIntosh and Stephanie Kirk from St. Luke's were elected to serve as delegates. **Amen!**



Next year's Annual Conference is right here in Highlands Ranch June 23-26! St. Andrew UMC will be the host location with some potential gatherings at St. Luke's. This is a great opportunity for you to be a part this exciting event. Save the dates, and look for more details in 2027!

Summer at St. Luke's: Time to Lean Into Faith

Now that it is June, summer has officially begun. Summer can be a time of vacation, reunions, travel, and overall general frivolity. As you read this edition of *The Chronicle*, I hope you find a few things to add some fun to your summer. This is also a season for community. It is a time to get together, hang out, do some projects together, or share a meal. In these pages you'll also find opportunities to gather with others through St. Luke's.

And, this is also a season of faith. When it gets hot in August, we have faith that it will cool off by the time October gets here. Holy Week at St. Luke's

From March 29th through April 5th, we marked the most important time in the annual life of the church: Holy Week. These were the eight days that began with Palm & Passion Sunday and culminated with Easter. During those eight days, we gathered for worship, reflection, and celebration.

- On Palm & Passion Sunday, we began Holy Week by leaning into the story of Jesus entering Jerusalem and creating sacred space in the Temple by flipping tables.
- On Thursday, we had a simple soup dinner and worshiped around the story and sacrament of Communion, including a washing of hands to symbolize our call to servant ministry.
- On Good Friday, worship focused on music and scripture. We heard the story of the crucifixion from the four Gospels and reflected on music that also told the story of that day. The service ended in a powerful way, with Dr. Jim singing "Were You There" as the cross was carried out of the sanctuary.
- On Holy Saturday, we held the emptiness and tension of a day when it seemed that the despair of Friday would last forever.
- On Easter morning, we celebrated the resurrection and the victory of life with sunrise worship outside at 6pm, and then had three worship services in the sanctuary.

Sacred Art and the Legacy of Pilgrimage Tattoos

I have been following the Razzouk Family on social media for the last few years. Generations of this family have been tattooing sacred designs for pilgrims to the Holy Land since the 1300s. In my mind, I knew that I would get a Razzouk tattoo when I had the opportunity to travel to the Holy Land. That opportunity has, of course, been postponed indefinitely.

I happened to have a moment of cell phone data right before our final choir performance in Patras, Greece. An Instagram post came up on my feed celebrating that the Razzouk family had established an Athens location. I had an overwhelming sense of excitement and resolve. I knew getting a Razzouk tattoo in Athens made sense because the whole trip had in fact been a spiritual pilgrimage as we walked many of the same paths as the Apostle Paul and early Christians in Ephesus, Corinth, Athens, and Patmos.

The Razzouk family uses stamps that are carved out of olive wood, some of which are hundreds of years old, to replicate the same sacred image over and over again. One of the most common images is the Jerusalem Cross which represents sharing the gospel to the four corners of the world. Dr. Jim, his sons Luke and Jack, and Jon Takayama all got Jerusalem Crosses below three crowns representing the Holy Trinity.

The tattoo I have on my wrist is the Holy Spirit in the form of the dove, descending during the baptism of Jesus, above an olive branch. For me, the images speak of peace and the movement of the Holy Spirit.

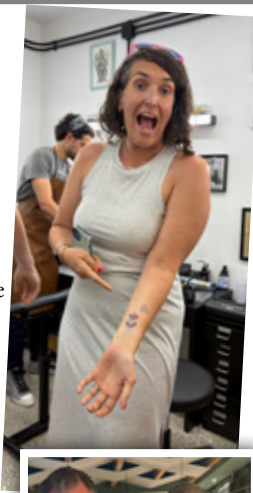
Our group included two first time tattoos! Lisé Takayama explained why by saying, “Eleven years ago I made a pact with two others to honor our friend and co-worker with a tattoo after she died from breast cancer much too young. I was too afraid to do it then. In Athens, I was loved and supported by my church family while getting a tattoo designed hundreds of years ago in Jerusalem. It was the perfect moment to bring our amazing trip to its conclusion.”

Amy Slade got a tattoo of two birds nesting in a tree which represents Love and Family. Angela Alderson's tattoo is a

beautiful image of the Annunciation - an angel appearing to Mary to announce the news that she would be the mother of Jesus. Angela reflected on the experience and shared, “I am not a spontaneous tattoo person. I am used to having a plan. But when Liza approached us after our last concert and talked about what she was thinking, I knew right then that I needed to be a part of it. I could not pass up the opportunity to have something that special tattooed on me.”

The communal and emotional experience of a group tattoo experience was unexpected for me. For many of us, encouraging and supporting one another became one of the most meaningful and bonding experiences. The youngest member of our trip, Cassandra Alderson, combined several stamps that resulted in a true work of art in a tattoo that took some time. During the afternoon, we took turns holding her hand, playing games, and listening to her favorite songs. She told me it was an experience of connection to her church family unlike anything else.

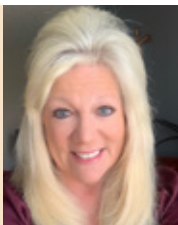
July 1, 11:00am will be a fun meal together. Main dish, drinks and tableware will be provided, bring a small side dish or dessert.

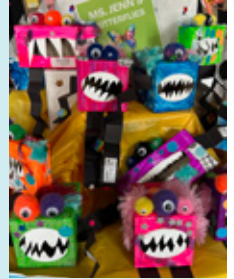

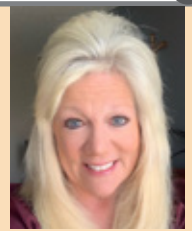

The week generations come together around something that matters. Children encounter scripture through drama, music, crafts, and hands-on science—giving every child, regardless of how they learn, a way in. When kids can see it, sing it, build it, and wonder about it, the story doesn't just inform them; it engages them. It stays with them. Each session draws children deeper into the Bible and into a growing relationship with God and the people around them. That's not separate from our church's mission—it's the mission, lived out in the best week of summer. When VBS week ends, kids don't just leave with a craft and a memory verse. They leave with a stronger biblical foundation, a clearer picture of God's love, an understanding that church is a great place to find supportive community, and a sense that their faith is something real—something that goes home with them, to school, to whatever comes next. And volunteers leave with the joy and satisfaction of knowing that they made a difference. Thanks to St. Luke's for supporting VBS!
